The competition is free to enter and is open to children and young people aged 4-24. We welcome entries from both groups and individuals. A group can be as small as 2 children, or as large as a whole school!

To ensure everyone has a chance to get involved, entries for group and individual categories will be judged separately and in the following age groups:

Ages 4 - 11 years Ages 11 - 16 years Ages 16 – 24 years

We request that art techniques are limited to works that can be hung on a wall - including painting, photography, textiles and collages. The size guide for entries is up to 70 x 80 cm.

Please state which age range and theme category you are submitting, child/group name and the name of the setting. Shortlisted entries will be collected week commencing 10th July with overall winners notified 14th July. Prizes and recognition certificates to be sent week commencing 17th July. Prizes: First prize winners will be awarded with a £50 voucher, shortlisted entrants will receive a £20 voucher. Everyone who enters the competition will receive a certificate of thanks and recognition. This is a great opportunity to inspire Children's Services staff. The artwork may also be used in other publications and settings as well as Council buildings.
